Record-Breaking Number of Attendees for Sixth Annual YN Live Auction

Young Numismatist (YN) participation continues to rise during the annual YN Live Auction event! This year, 81 Young Numismatists participated in the virtual live event, beating last year's number of 74. A total of 110 lots were sold to 44 YNs. A record number of YN Dollars also were spent this year—\$31,995.

The third top-selling lot this year was a silver 1838 1 1/2 pence issued by Great Britain, made for use in the British colonies of Ceylon and Jamaica. It sold for \$850 YN Dollars. The second top-selling lot was a gold coin (Lot #51; 1945 Mexico 2 1/2 pesos, in Choice Almost Uncirculated condition). It sold for \$2,600 YN Dollars. The overall top-selling lot was a 1776 thaler (Lot #37, large silver dollar-sized, or "crown"-sized coin) from the German State of Bavaria, in Extremely Fine condition, which sold for \$3,100 YN Dollars.

ANA Coin Press: "The First National Bank of Tustin"

During its 24-year history, a California financial institution issued four types of notes, of which very few exist today.



Read "The First National Bank of Tustin"

The first national bank of Tustin was located on the northwest corner of West Main Street and El Camino Real ("D" Street) in the heart of today's Old Town Tustin in Orange County, California. Sadly, it was torn down in 1963 because of its structural instability and concerns about earthquakes. Not much remains of the original building, but if you compare the current site to past images, you can see that remnants of the Victorian-era brick bank are still attached to the side of the former Tustin Hardware, now a U.S. Post Office and Mrs. B's antique shop.

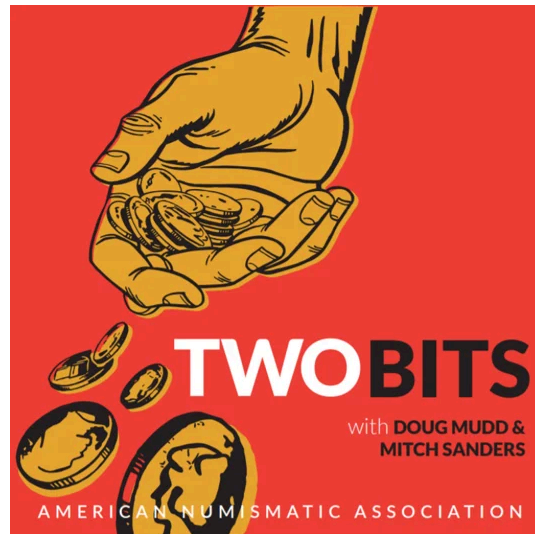
