## YN AUCTION

**The 6th Annual Live Auction is Sept. 12!**

**When:** Saturday, Sept. 12 at 10 a.m. (MST)

**Where:** Online! YNs must have a Google account to participate in the auction.

**To Register:** Email [sgelberd@money.org](mailto:sgelberd@money.org) your name, address, phone number and screen name from your Google account. Those who register will receive a confirmation email.



To ensure that auction dollars are received prior to the event, YNs are encouraged to **submit all YN dollar requests no later than Tuesday, Sept. 1 (TODAY)**. YN dollars are the **only** form of payment accepted for auction items. Only current ANA members ages 5-17 may participate.

## Important "Do's and Dont's" to Keep in Mind for the Live Auction

### DO:

- Register to participate **no later** than Thursday, Sept. 10 at midnight (MST). Trying to register after this time will not allow you to participate. Trying to join the chat the morning of the auction will not work. **Bids are not accepted unless it is from a valid screen name.**
- Read **ALL** of the [auction rules, terms & conditions of sale, and tips](#) well before the auction. Review the lots in advance and decide which ones interest you the most.
- Develop a strategy by deciding how much you are willing to spend on each lot, based on the amount of YN Dollars you have in hand (and follow this strategy!).
- Bid early if you are serious about winning a lot! There is a time delay between the actual time at the ANA and the time it takes for bid to get uploaded to the website.

Make sure you don't lose out on lots because once the hammer falls and a lot is closed, that lot is done and we move on to the next one (**do not hesitate!**).

- Keep track of the lot(s) you've won, and keep a running total of how much you will have to send in for payment – you don't want to realize you ran out of YN Dollars for something you really wanted!
- Click on the "**YN Live Auction Bidding Increments**" link on the [YN Auction page](#) of the ANA website. These are the amounts that will be accepted for bids. You may place a "cut bid" (or a bid for less than the next bidding increment amount) **only after the opening minimum bid has been announced and placed by someone.**
- Make sure you have resolved any technical issues well before the auction starts (is your portable device fully charged?)

### **DON'T:**

- Try to arrange deals with other YNs for specific lots. It is up to you to bid strategically for any items you are interested in. Asking your friends not to bid on something just because you want to increase your chances of winning often does not end well. There are several YNs bidding on these lots, so it is up to **YOU** to develop a winning strategy, based on the amount of YN Dollars you have and are willing to part with.
- Try to place "buy" or "unlimited" bids before the auction starts. Bids for each lot are only accepted live and for only one lot at a time. Minimum bids are already posted in the catalog. Unless the auctioneer states otherwise, you may not place a cut bid for lower than the opening amount.
- Ask if you can use "real" money to pay for any lots. **YN Dollars are the ONLY form of payment accepted for an ANA YN Auction.**
- Send in payments without having received an invoice first! And if you cannot send the exact amount for payment, no worries – you will receive change in YN Dollars.
- Try to bid on any lots for a friend or relative. YN Dollars are not transferable, and it is the sole responsibility of each bidder to be sure they are current ANA members and have registered ahead of time, if they wish to participate.

***The auctioneer reserves the right to deny any bidder a particular lot, if it has been determined that one or more of the auction rules are not being respected.***

## Tales from the Vault: "The Multiple Thalers of Brunswick"

*Tales from the Vault is a series of articles that feature objects in the Money Museum's collection that do not often (or ever) get to see the light of day.*

Thalers are silver coins minted in the Holy Roman Empire and Prussia from the 16th to 19th centuries. Their name was taken from *Joachimsthaler*; the first thalers were produced in the town of Joachimsthal. Our current world "dollar" is derived from "thaler." Some of the largest of these coins are the "multiple thalers" issued beginning in 1574 by Duke and Prince Julius of Brunswick-Lüneburg and Brunswick-Wolfenbüttel. These large pieces, known as "juliusloeser" (Julius Redeemers) or "loeser," have been popular among collectors since the 18th century. Their large size allowed for the creation of beautiful portraits and designs in a wide variety of subjects. The ANA is fortunate to have a collection of these fascinating pieces.

**Revived Money Museum Exhibit Now Online**

From 2007-08, the Money Museum featured an exhibit called "Coins, Crown & Conflict: An Exploration of Cromwell's England." It was based on the history of the English Civil Wars and featured some of the great rarities of English coins (including the Petition Crown), and some of the earliest American coins. Although no longer on display at the museum, the exhibit can now be appreciated virtually.

The exhibit explores the period starting with the reign of Charles I and the English Civil Wars to the first years of the restored British monarchy under Charles II, through the coins, medals, people and objects associated with Oliver Cromwell. It is our privilege to display the Geoffrey Cope Collection, one of the finest collections of coins from this period, to help tell the story of this turbulent time in English history.
