The United States and its neighbors are connected by geography, history and economics, so it's not surprising that their numismatic legacies also are closely related, with many comparisons, and some contrasts, among the three countries.

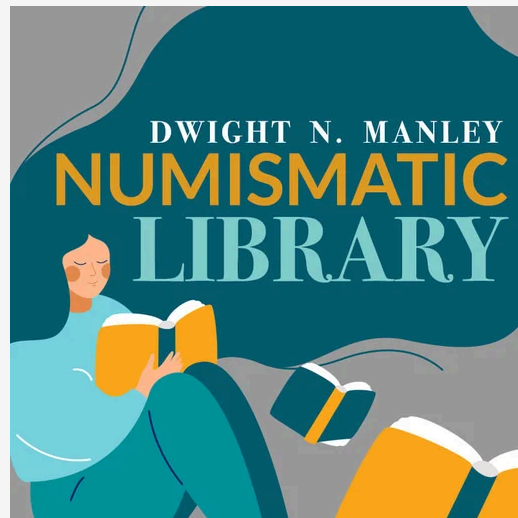
ANA Library Resumes Lending to Members

As a member of the ANA, you have access to the world's largest numismatic lending library. More than 128,000 books are available at the library. These books feature

coins, paper money, tokens, medals, military orders and decorations, and stocks and bonds. There are also volumes on collecting in general, economics, and banks and banking.

The library has been closed for COVID precautionary measures, but, remote lending and copying services have now resumed on a limited basis.

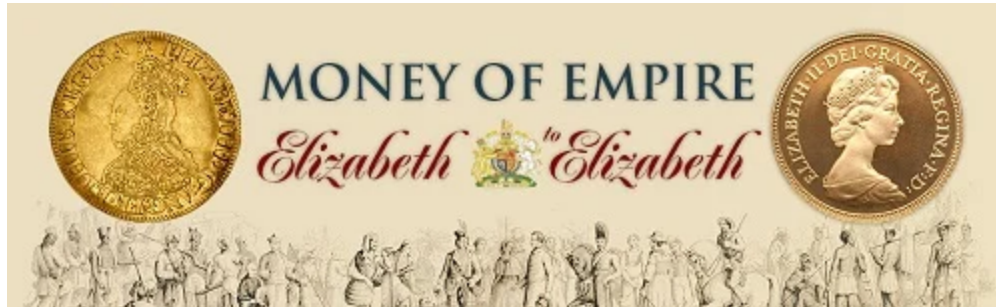
