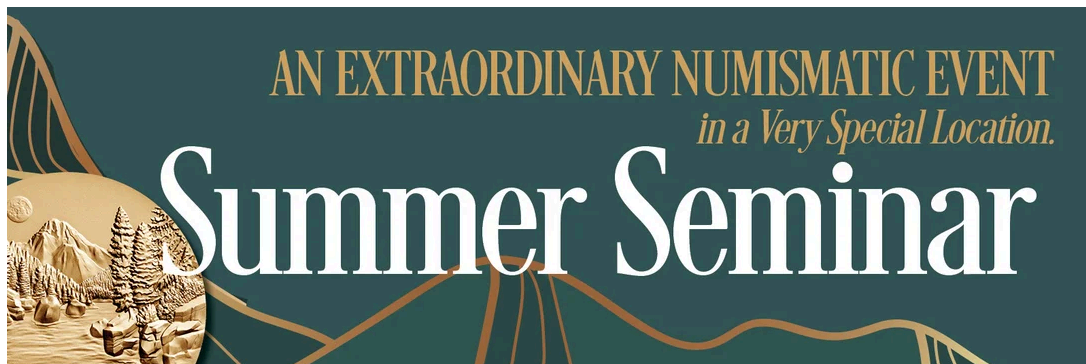
# ANA Coin Press – "Collecting Friends: My First Slab"

**Earn a College Scholarship**  
**for Numismatic Involvement**



Applications for the Gerome Walton Memorial College Scholarships, provided by the ANA, are being accepted through March 13. The scholarship fund provides a graduating high school senior, who is also a member of the ANA, with \$1,000 to use at the university, community college or trade school in the U.S. of the student's choice.

This scholarship can be used for tuition, books or supplies directly related to class requirements. Up to two scholarships may be awarded annually. Students with a full class schedule, who maintain a B average throughout their higher education, can receive the \$1,000 scholarship up to four years.

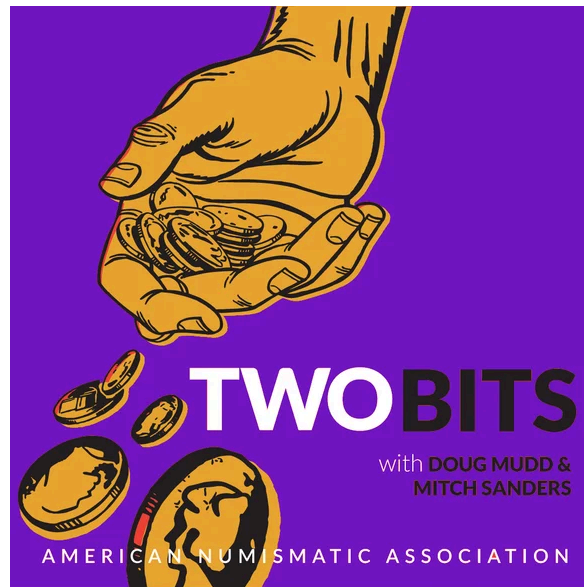
